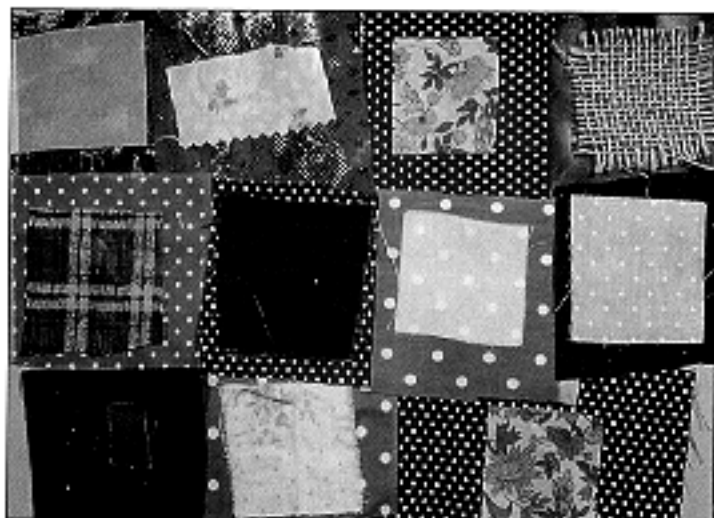


# Textiles

**Session** Two

**Activity** Cutting and joining textiles using tape and glue.

**Focus** Shape



**Equipment Needed** Masking tape, assorted textiles cut into a range of shapes and sizes, sharp scissors, P.V.A. glue.

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## Talk About

- Patchwork patterns that are joined together.
  - Textile shapes that will fit together from the group ready cut for them to use.
  - Masking tape - how much to undo, how to cut it, where the sticky part is.
  - Putting fabric side by side.
  - Pressing tape down on two pieces of fabric to join them together.
  - Adding shapes on top with glue.
  - How much glue and where to use it.
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## Doing

- Choose two pieces of fabric.
  - Put them side by side next to each other.
  - Cut a piece of masking tape - to fit the size of the fabric.
  - Press it down gently.
  - Now choose another piece, put it next to the joined pieces.
  - Cut some more tape and join this piece of fabric on. Add one more.
  - Finally you have a row of fabric pieces joined together.
  - Turn it over and the tape is now out of sight on the back.
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## Developing the Idea

- Decorate your row of fabric by gluing some smaller shapes on top.
  - Cut your own shapes to make a row.
  - Add a second row. Decide where else to join and tape.
  - Make a square of joined pieces.
